

Thoughts on the Conference in Keszthely

On 19 June 2022, we organized a conference with the title of "A State- a Dream Come True" inspired by the fact that Tivadar Herzl's book "Old New Land" was published 120 years ago.

In my greeting speech, I underlined the purpose of the event as follows:

"With today's event, we want to further strengthen our commitment to Israel and express our love, appreciation and admiration to the Israeli people who are building a new country on ancient land."

However, in order to achieve this goal, it is also necessary to obtain credible information about the real situation in the face of distortions in the international media. This was greatly aided by the presentation of our dear guest, Mr. Yigal Dilmoni, CEO of the Yesha Council, entitled "Zionism in the Land of the Heart of the Bible".

The extremely demanding presentation outlined the historical right of the settlers to their ancient land through biblical events, and, by discussing the events of the present day, shed light on the fate of the Judea-Samaria region from a lesser-known side. It was shocking to see how much money the European Union and some countries have spent on supporting a Palestinian organization which illegally seizes land. As believers in biblical truths, we also have been stunned by the destructive efforts of the Palestinian Authority to destroy archaeological and material relics that prove the authenticity of the Bible and Israeli history, thereby falsifying historical reality.

As a secondary school and university teacher, I would like to note that the history of the Arab Israeli wars is part of the speaking graduation exam, and at St. Paul's Academy, the Theological University of the Faith Church, we teach the history of modern Israel as a two-semester compulsory subject.
